You could use boxes, lego, building blocks etc. How high can you make it without it falling over?</p>

You could build a 3D model, paint or colour a picture, use cut pieces from magazines to make a collage.</p>	<p>Play medieval music and create a dance that may have been performed during medieval times.</p>
<p>If you like to be out and about...</p>	<p>Visit a famous historical site or landmark with your family. Take some pictures! (e.g. Thornton Abbey is an English Heritage site nearby).</p>	<p>Build your very own outdoor castle! You could use tarpaulin, boxes, old sheets etc.</p>	<p>Recreate a jousting tournament with your family. You could run and aim at a target with a stick. (You will need an adult to supervise this activity).</p>
